

R&I Missions

Relating EU's research and innovation better to society and citizens' needs; with strong visibility and impact

A mission is a portfolio of actions across disciplines intended to achieve a **bold and inspirational and measurable goal** within a set timeframe, with **impact** for society and policy making as well as relevance for a significant part of the European population and wide range of European citizens.

Horizon Europe defines mission characteristics and elements of governance, and **5 missions areas**. Specific missions will be programmed within the Global Challenges and European Industrial Competitiveness pillar, but may also benefit from actions carried out within other parts of the Programme as well as complementary actions carried out under other Union programmes.



Open Science across the programme

Open Science

Mainstreaming of open science practices for improved quality and efficiency of R&I, and active engagement of society

Mandatory immediate Open Access to publications: beneficiaries must retain sufficient IPRs to comply with open access requirements;

Data sharing as 'open as possible, as closed as necessary': mandatory Data Management Plan for FAIR (Findable, Accessible, Interoperable, Reusable) research data

- Work Programmes may incentivize or oblige to adhere to **open science practices** such as involvement of citizens, or to use the **European Open Science Cloud**
- Assessment of open science practices through the **award criteria** for proposal evaluation
- Dedicated support to **open science policy actions**
- **Open Research Europe** publishing platform

Horizon Europe key features

- Horizon Europe funds research and innovation activities mainly through **open and competitive calls for proposals**
- **Calls for proposals** are published through **Work Programmes on a regular basis** and evaluated through a peer-review process
- Projects are selected based on excellence, impact and quality of implementation, and the programme follows **strict “time-to-grant”** rules to ensure efficiency and transparency



International Cooperation

International Cooperation

Tackling together global societal challenges; access to the world's best talents, expertise and resources; enhanced supply and demand of innovative solutions

Association to Horizon Europe

- Third countries complying with specific requirements (policy and R&I values) with good capacity in science, technology and innovation
- Taking into account objective of driving economic growth in Europe through innovation
- Intensified targeted actions
- Strengthened support to multilateral cooperation
- Openness to international participation balanced with the promotion of EU strategic autonomy

Horizon Europe's general openness

- Horizon Europe 'by-default' as open as possible to **almost all countries**
- Almost any **project consortium can include an entity from third country partner** (with or without EU funding) unless specified otherwise
- **Association to Horizon Europe** is the deepest way of integration – however, it is not a prerequisite for participating to the Programme


Participation (1) consortium composition

Minimum conditions for CONSORTIA

- *At least 3 independent entities*
- *established in 3 different Member States or Associated Countries*
- *At least 1 entity established in a Member State*



- Once the minimum requirement has been met, the consortium may **include as many organizations as are considered necessary for the project**, from EU Member States, associated countries, and other third countries.
- **There is no maximum number of organizations that can participate in a project** (exceptions, article 22 and call specific conditions)



Participation (2) – International Cooperation targeted

- Associated countries are not in principle mentioned in targeted calls (exception for Ukraine)
- Targeted international cooperation actions can be (wording important: e.g., welcome, strongly welcome or **requested**):
 - In topics of strategic thematic areas
 - For geographical areas (countries/regions), Initiatives: African Union, **Mediterranean countries**, Latin-America-Caribbean countries
 - For countries participants in multilateral initiatives (e.g., Mission Innovation)
 - Collaboration with key individual partner countries

Who is eligible for EU funding?



EU COUNTRIES

- Member States (MS) including their outermost regions
- The Overseas Countries and Territories (OCTs) linked to the MS.



NON-EU COUNTRIES

- Countries associated to Horizon Europe (AC)
- Low and middle income countries ([link: here](#))
- Other countries when announced in the call or exceptionally if their participation is essential



SPECIFIC CASES

- Affiliated entities established in countries eligible for funding.
- EU bodies
- **International organisations (IO):**
 - International European research organisations are eligible for funding.
 - Other IO are not eligible (only exceptionally if participation is essential)
 - IO in a MS or AC are eligible for funding for Training and mobility actions and when announced in the call conditions

Access to EU Funding

- Legal entities eligible for funding – art. 23 - established in
- **EU Member State**
 - **Associated Countries**
 - **Low to middle income non-associated third countries**
 - **Other non-associated third countries** (high income countries per World Bank classification) shall be eligible for funding in an action **only in exceptional cases, if:**
 - the third country is identified in the work programme adopted by the Commission;
 - the Commission or the relevant funding body considers that the participation of the legal entity concerned is essential for implementing the action.



Novelties in WP 2026-2027

1. The work programme is designed to be more strategic, focused, simpler, and accessible, with a reduction in fragmentation of the available budget.
2. It includes a new part called "Horizontal Activities" which groups the horizontal calls and aims to create critical mass and avoid duplication of budget.
3. It allocates €50 million to the "Choose Europe for Science" initiative to improve long-term fellowships and postdoctoral career stability.
4. It encourages international cooperation, but also imposes restrictions on participation in certain topics, including those related to 5G, 6G, and communication network equipment.
5. It has been simplified, with a 33% reduction in length, fewer and more concise topics, and a relative decrease in one-project-only topics.
6. It has increased the use of lump sums, with at least 50% of the Horizon Europe call budget allocated through lump sums.
7. It includes simplified proposal forms implying a reduction of the standard page limits by 5 pages.





Personalised access to the Funding & Tenders Portal is based on 3 elements:

1. Each user is supposed to have a **unique EU Login account**, which is the **unique identifier for persons** (linked to their professional email address).
2. Each EU Login account is linked to one (or more) **PIC number(s)**, which are the **unique identifier for organisations**.
3. Each EU Login account is linked to all the **roles** that the user has in projects and/or organisations through IAM.











Minimum conditions for CONSORTIA

- *At least 3 independent entities*
- *established in 3 different Member States or Associated Countries*
- *At least 1 entity established in a Member State*



- Once the minimum requirement has been met, the consortium may **include as many organizations as are considered necessary for the project**, from EU Member States, associated countries, and other third countries.
- **There is no maximum number of organizations that can participate in a project** (exceptions, article 22 and call specific conditions)







Objective

About 40M people in low- and middle-income countries (LMIC) suffer from epilepsy-related seizures but not all are diagnosed and treated due to the lack of electroencephalogram (EEG) devices and neurologists in these regions. BrainCapture (BC) is developing an EEG-based diagnosis service (BrainCap) for epilepsy and other neurological disorders that fits LMIC needs since it is affordable, uses mobile phone infrastructure and does not need an EEG expert on-site for data capture due to an AI-based Quality Control (QC) algorithm. Data is analysed by remotely placed neurologists who provide a diagnosis and treatment plan via the BrainCap app/cloud. Our field trials revealed that there is a clinical need for BrainCap. Now, we will finish the product design, optimize the QC algorithm, and extend clinical validation to multiple sites to convince KOLs in several primary markets. The EIC investment will be key to create EEG market in LMICs, leveraging a significant business opportunity for BC.






The proposed project aims to study the relations between inequalities and young people's ways of doing politics as well as to advance scenarios for future democratic models and political systems in Europe that are more inclusive for young people. The research design consists of a multidimensional theoretical framework that combines macro-level (institutional), meso-level (organizational), and micro-level (individual) explanatory factors, a cross-national comparative design that includes nine European countries with different institutional arrangements and policies towards youth, and an integrated methodological approach based on multiple sources and methods (policy analysis, claims-making analysis, organizational survey, panel survey, survey experiments, biographical interviews, and social media analysis).

Admissibility

Same general admissibility conditions

- Applications must be submitted before the call deadline, **electronically** via the Funding & Tenders Portal
- Applications must be **complete, readable, accessible and printable**, and include a **plan for the exploitation and dissemination of results** (see application form templates), unless provided otherwise in the specific call conditions.

Proposal page limit

- RIAs and IAs type of actions: limit for a full application is **45 pages**
- CSAs: limit is **30 pages**
- First stage proposals: limit is **10 pages**
- EIC Pathfinder: limit is **17 pages**
- Exceptions, if any, would be specified in the call text.



NEW 2026 - Reduction in page limits

Following the simplification of sections 2 and 3, page limits for application form part Bs are reduced by 5 pages. The new standard page limits are

- 40 pages for actual costs RIA and IA
- 45 pages for lump sum RIA and IA
- 25 pages for actual costs CSA
- 28 pages for lump sum CSA
- 65 pages for HORIZON-COFUND
- 40 pages for PCP
- 40 pages for PPI

Specific calls might use different page limits when specifically mentioned in the work programme and call documents.

!! These changes apply only to calls from Work Programme 2026-2027.

Calls from Work Programme 2025 and launched in 2026 will use the 2025 templates and page limits.



Application form (proposal template)

Standard templates per type of action are published in the F&T Portal

The actual template that applies to a call/topic is the one you download in the Submission system for that specific call/topic.



The proposal contains two parts:

- **Part A** (web-based forms) is generated by the IT system. It is based on the information entered by the participants through the submission system in the Funding & Tenders Portal.
- **Part B** is the narrative part that includes three sections that each correspond to an evaluation criterion. Part B needs to be uploaded as a PDF document following the templates downloaded by the applicants in the submission system for the specific call or topic.



Application form – Part A (web-based forms)

- **General information on the proposal:** Title, acronym, abstract, duration, keywords
- **Participants:** organisation details are filled-in automatically from data in our participant registry. Contact persons, identity of researchers involved, role of the participant in the project, participants' previous activities related to the call, and declaration of gender equality plan.
- **Budget of the proposal**
- **Ethics and security** questionnaires and self-assessment
- **Other questions** depending on the call (e.g. clinical trials, second stage proposals, etc.)
- **Declarations** signed by project coordinator on behalf of the consortium



Application form – Part B (PDF)

- Template must be **downloaded from submission tool** (templates published in the F&T Portal are for information purpose only)
- The template includes extensive **instructions**, and its structure follows the **evaluation criteria**
- It is normally subject to **page limits**. Actual page limit applicable are clearly announced in the topic text. Page limits are applied automatically:
 - If you attempt to upload a proposal longer than the specified limit before the deadline, you will receive an automatic warning and will be advised to shorten and re-upload the proposal. After the deadline, excess pages (in over-long proposals) will be automatically made invisible and will not be taken into consideration by the evaluators.



Evaluation (award) criteria

Same criteria as in previous R&I Programmes

Same three award criteria: '**Excellence**', '**Impact**' and '**Quality and efficiency of the implementation**'. Excellence only for ERC.

Adapted following lessons learnt

- **Open Science** practices assessed as part of the scientific methodology in the excellence criterion
- **New approach to impact**: Key Impacts Pathways (KIPs)
- The assessment of the **quality of applicants** is assessed under 'implementation', rather than as a separate binary assessment of operational capacity
- Assessment of **management structures** has been removed.



Evaluation criteria (RIAs and IAs)

EXCELLENCE

- ✓ Clarity and pertinence of the **project's objectives**, and the extent to which the proposed work is ambitious, and goes beyond the state-of-the-art.
- ✓ Soundness of the proposed **methodology**, including the underlying concepts, models, assumptions, interdisciplinary approaches, appropriate consideration of the **gender dimension** in research and innovation content, and the quality of **open science practices** including sharing and management of research outputs and engagement of citizens, civil society and end users where appropriate.

IMPACT

- ✓ Credibility of the **pathways** to achieve the expected **outcomes and impacts** specified in the work programme, and the likely scale and significance of the contributions due to the project.
- ✓ Suitability and quality of the **measures to maximize expected outcomes and impacts**, as set out in the dissemination and exploitation plan, including communication activities.

QUALITY AND EFFICIENCY OF THE IMPLEMENTATION

- ✓ Quality and effectiveness of the **work plan**, assessment of risks, and appropriateness of the effort assigned to work packages, and the resources overall.
- ✓ Capacity and role of each **participant**, and extent to which the **consortium** as a whole brings together the necessary expertise.

Proposals aspects are assessed to the extent that the proposed work is within the scope of the work programme topic

Key principles to write a proposal



Your proposed work must be within the scope of a work programme topic



You need to demonstrate that your idea is ambitious and goes beyond the state of the art



Your scientific methodology must take into account interdisciplinarity, gender dimension and open science practices.



You should show how your project could contribute to the outcomes and impacts described in the work programme (the pathway to impact)



You should describe the planned measures to maximise the impact of your project ('plan for the dissemination and exploitation including communication activities')



You should demonstrate the quality of your work plan, resources and participants

These aspects must normally be considered in all Horizon Europe calls (unless explicitly mentioned in the topic description).

Specific calls may include other aspects to take into account.



Open Science across the programme

Open Science

Open science is an approach based on open cooperative work and systematic sharing of knowledge and tools as early and widely as possible in the process. Including active engagement of society

Mandatory immediate Open Access to publications: beneficiaries must retain sufficient IPRs to comply with open access requirements;

Data sharing as ‘open as possible, as closed as necessary’: mandatory Data Management Plan for FAIR (Findable, Accessible, Interoperable, Reusable) research data

- Work Programmes may incentivize or oblige to adhere to **open science practices** such as involvement of citizens, or to use the **European Open Science Cloud**
- Assessment of open science practices through the **excellence award criteria** for proposal evaluation. Under **quality of participants** previous experience on open sciences practices will be evaluated positively.
- Dedicated support to **open science policy actions**
- **Open Research Europe** publishing platform



Gender dimension in R&I content

Gender Dimension

Addressing the gender dimension in research and innovation entails taking into account sex and gender in the whole research & innovation process.

The integration of the gender dimension into R&I content is **mandatory**, unless it is explicitly mentioned in the topic description


Examples

- Is there a risk of gender bias and how will you address it?
- Does gender influence the result of experiments in any possible way?
Example: pheromones given off by men experimenters, but not women, induce a stress response in laboratory rodents which may affect their perception of pain.
- Are there possible effects on gender or sex in your field of study?
Example: climate change affects sex determination of various marine species and certain populations are at risk of extinction
- Why do we observe differences between women and men in infection levels and mortality rates in the COVID-19 pandemic?
- Which body standards should be used as a basis for the design of car safety equipment?
- Are AI applications trained on data diverse enough to avoid spreading gender biases?



Describing the impact of your proposal

Link between policy priorities and project results





Measures to maximise impact

Dissemination, exploitation and communication

To include a draft plan in proposal is an admissibility condition, unless the work programme topic explicitly states otherwise.

All measures should be **proportionate** to the scale of the project, and should contain **concrete actions** to be implemented both **during and after** the end of the project

Elements of the D&E&C plan

- **Planned measures** to maximise the impact of projects
- **Target groups** (e.g. scientific community, end users, financial actors, public at large) and **proposed channels** to interact
- **Communication measures** for promoting the project and its findings throughout the full lifespan of the project
- **Policy feedback** measures to contribute to policy shaping and supporting the implementation of new policy initiatives and decisions
- Follow-up plan to foster **exploitation/uptake** of the results
 - Comprehensive and feasible strategy for the **management of the intellectual property** (the provision of a results ownership list is mandatory at the end of the project)
 - If exploitation is expected primarily in non-associated third countries, give a convincing justification that this is still in the Union's interest.



Do no significant harm principle (DNSH)

European Green Deal

In line with the European Green Deal objectives, economic activities should not make a significant harm to any of the six environmental objectives (EU Taxonomy Regulation)

- Applicants **can refer to the DNSH principle** when presenting their research methodology and the expected impacts of the project, to show that their project will not carry out activities that make a significant harm to any of the six environmental objectives of the EU Taxonomy Regulation.

Adherence with the do no significant harm principle is a requirement only for EIC actions, not for the other parts of the Horizon Europe Work Programme.

The six environmental objectives :



Climate change mitigation



Sustainable use & protection of water & marine resources



Pollution prevention & control



Climate change adaptation



Transition to a circular economy



Protection and restoration of biodiversity & ecosystems



Artificial intelligence

Trustworthy Artificial Intelligence

Due diligence is explicitly required regarding the trustworthiness of all AI-based systems/ techniques used or developed in projects funded under the EIC work programme.

AI-based systems or techniques should be, or be developed to become:

- **Technically robust, accurate and reproducible**, and able to deal with and inform about possible failures, inaccuracies and errors, proportionate to the assessed risk posed by the AI-based system or technique.
- **Socially robust**, in that they duly consider the context and environment in which they operate.
- **Reliable and function as intended**, minimizing unintentional and unexpected harm, preventing unacceptable harm and safeguarding the physical and mental integrity of humans.
- Able to provide a suitable explanation of its **decision-making process**, whenever an AI-based system can have a significant impact on people's lives.

The use of generative AI tools in the preparation of proposals

General disclaimer included in the latest version of the proposal templates

When considering the use of generative artificial intelligence (AI) tools for the preparation of the proposal, it is imperative to exercise caution and careful consideration. The AI-generated content should be thoroughly reviewed and validated by the applicants to ensure its appropriateness and accuracy, as well as its compliance with intellectual property regulations. **Applicants are fully responsible for the content of the proposal** (even those parts produced by the AI tool) and must be transparent in disclosing which AI tools were used and how they were utilised.

Specifically, **applicants are required** to:

- **Verify the accuracy, validity, and appropriateness** of the content and any citations generated by the AI tool and correct any errors or inconsistencies.
- **Provide a list of sources used to generate content and citations**, including those generated by the AI tool. Double-check citations to ensure they are accurate and properly referenced.
- **Be conscious of the potential for plagiarism** where the AI tool may have reproduced substantial text from other sources. Check the original sources to be sure you are not plagiarising someone else's work.
- **Acknowledge the limitations of the AI tool** in the proposal preparation, including the potential for bias, errors, and gaps in knowledge.

Frequent shortcomings



Excellence

- Objectives not fully pertinent to the call
- Proposal not ambitious enough and/or not going beyond the state of the art
- Requirements not fully addressed (i.e. Multi-Actor Approach)

Impact

- Proposal not convincingly demonstrating its contribution to all expected outcomes (i.e. pathways to expected outcomes and impacts are not credible)
- Communication, exploitation and dissemination are not differentiated

Implementation

- Work packages not in line with objectives and not clearly interlinked.
- Work plan not sufficiently detailed and allocation of resources not adequately justified
- Operational capacity not demonstrated



Preparation tips (1)

- **Read carefully** the Work Programme (+relevant annexes) and topic text.
- **Check the criteria** by which your proposal will be assessed.
- Use the **templates** available; read carefully instructions (number of pages, font, ...).
- **Check relevant projects** already funded (CORDIS) and build on previous research results.
- Contact your **NCP** for guidance.
- **Avoid recycling former proposals or project partners** with no specific contribution.
- Looking for **potential partners** → partner search on F&T Portal + Brokerage event.
- **All members of consortium** should be **involved** in the drafting of the proposal.
- Don't underestimate the **budget and expertise needed for CDE**.
- Make sure that the **cost/benefit ratio is sound**.
- Submit your proposal a **few days before the call deadline**.

Preparation tips (2)



Write with the evaluators in mind

- **Grab their attention** in the first half page.
- Set out what you are going to do, how you are going to do it, what the **outcome** will be and why you are the best people to do the work.
- Write **clearly and concisely**. Explain your research in **simple terms** and **avoid jargon**.
- Not all evaluators have English as their first **language**, use **straightforward** language.
- Help evaluators finding information, by referring to specific work packages, milestones etc.
- Ask for a 'fresh eye' and impartial colleague to **proof read**.







Time to grant and time to inform





Evaluation process in HE

- Proposals in Horizon Europe are evaluated by **independent external experts** against clear criteria that are set out in the Work Programme (with some exceptions for EIC, missions and CSAs).
- A **minimum of three experts** evaluate each proposal (often we call for more than three experts).
- Individual experts agree in a **common opinion** which is the basis of the feedback the participants will receive.
- The panel of evaluators in a topic agree in the **ranking of proposals**. The budget available for the topic will be the basis to decide whether the proposal is:
 - Retained for funding and invited to start grant agreement preparation
 - Reserve list
 - Rejected because low funding available
 - Rejected because low quality



Standard evaluation process

Individual evaluation

Experts assess proposals **individually**. Minimum of three experts per proposal (but often more than three).

Consensus group

All individual experts discuss together to agree on a **common position**, including comments and scores for each proposal.

Panel review

The panel of experts reach an **agreement** on the scores and comments for all proposals within a call, checking **consistency across the evaluations**.

if necessary, resolve cases where evaluators were unable to agree.

Rank the proposals with the same score

Finalisation

The Commission/Agency reviews the results of the experts' evaluation and puts together the **final ranking list**.



Feedback to applicants

- Applicants are informed within 5 months after call deadline with an **evaluation result letter** and the **evaluation summary report**.
- The **outcome** of the evaluation can be:
 - Retained for funding
 - Reserve list
 - Rejected because no sufficient budget in the call
 - Rejected because low quality
- In **two-stages calls** applicants are informed about the results of the evaluation, but no evaluation summary report (ESR) is sent for successful stage 1 proposals. Instead, we publish generalised feedback as a call update in the Portal. The ESR from stage 1 is sent together with the ESR for stage 2.



Guiding principles in evaluations

- **Excellence**

Proposals must demonstrate high quality in relation to the topics and criteria set out in the calls.

- **Transparency**

Funding decisions must be based on clearly described rules and procedures, and applicants should receive adequate feedback on the outcome of the evaluation.

- **Fairness & impartiality**

All proposals submitted in response to a call must be treated equally and evaluated impartially on their merits, irrespective of their origin or the identity of the applicants.

- **Efficiency & speed**

Evaluation, award and grant preparation should be done as quickly as possible without compromising quality or neglecting the rules.

- **Ethics & security**

The Commission/Agency must ensure that the research and innovation activities will be carried out in compliance with fundamental ethical principles and the applicable rules on ethics and security.

- **Confidentiality**

Proposals (as well as any related information, data, and documents) must be treated confidentially; experts are bound by an obligation of confidentiality.

- **Data protection**

Personal data must be processed under EU Data Protection Regulation.




