



Eligibility: how do I get involved – where do I fit in?

- Where are you from? Can you be the leader or only a partner?
- What type of organisation are you?
- Is your partnership correctly structured?
- What activities are you proposing? Where?
- How long will your project last?







Skills policy is inseparable from economic policy


Skills for employability, where skills development is reverse-engineered, starting from real demands, created by Global Gateway investments

Examples of green Global Gateway regional investments in Asia

- **Regional South Asia:** South Asia Energy Connectivity: support to development of regional energy market and investment environment in Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Nepal.
- **Regional Asia:** Sustainable Aviation Fuels – supporting the development, production and use of sustainable aviation fuels
- **Regional Asia:** Northern EU Digital Gateways – initiating trusted and secure subsea cable projects to enhance connectivity between Europe and Japan via the Arctic



Examples of green Global Gateway bilateral investments in Asia

- **Laos: Increasing investment, connectivity and trade in agriculture and forestry**
- **Pakistan: Climate Resilient Infrastructure (hydropower and irrigation systems)**
- **Philippines: Digital Transformation and Connectivity**




Geographical scope of Erasmus Mundus



What is an Erasmus Mundus Joint Master programme?



Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters – Main objectives



Support quality, innovation, excellence, internationalisation of HEIs through **academic cooperation** within the EHEA and beyond



Increase synergies between **higher education, innovation and research**



Increase **quality and attractiveness** of the European Higher Education Area (EHEA)



Improve **competences, skills and employability** of Master graduates




Support **EU External Action** in higher education



Respond to **societal and labour market needs**

Joint mechanisms must be included in the design of the master programme



EMJM Set-up



Grant Agreement of 74 months independently from the length of the master



Commitment to **enrol a certain number of students** per project



At least 4 master editions lasting 1 to 2 academic years (60, 90 or 120 ECTS)



At least 2 study periods in 2 countries (of which at least one in an EU MS or a 3rd country associated to the Programme, both different from the country of residence of students)



Start of the 1st edition no later than the academic year following the year of project selection



Geographical balance of students: ≤10% of total scholarships per project awarded to students of the same nationality (does not apply to additional scholarships for targeted regions)

Taking part as an Organisation



Applicants (coordinator & full partners) must be HEIs (**legal entities**) established in any country worldwide. Any public or private organization worldwide may also participate but not as coordinator



For HEIs in EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme: **valid ECHE**



For HEIs in third countries not associated to the Programme: should **commit to ECHE principles** in the Partnership Agreement




For HEIs applying as coordinator and full partners: **completed accreditation/evaluation of the master programme** 




Minimum consortium: **3 HEIs from 3 different countries** of which at least 2 must be an EU MS or third country associated to the Programme. Optional: other full academic or non-academic partners and associated partners

Taking part as an Individual



Open to applicants **worldwide**

Applicants must:

- hold **a first higher education degree** or equivalent
- not have benefited previously from an EMJM scholarship




The best ones can benefit from a scholarship depending on the number of scholarships available



What is ICM?

- Launched in the 2014-2020 programme to fund **short-term mobility of students and staff** between Programme and Partner countries
- Manifold **benefits for individuals and institutions**:
 - Key skills & competences, professional development, enhanced employability, teaching methods, etc.
 - Increased capacities, attractiveness & internationalisation; improved quality of higher education

Activities supported (I)


- Short-term higher education mobility for students, academic and administrative staff
- All levels: Bachelor, Master and PhD candidates
- Mobility in any subject or academic discipline
- Duration: 2-3 years projects
- Also supports traineeships for students and training for staff
- Study periods and traineeships of 2 – 12 months
- Staff mobility for teaching or training of 5 days – 2 months
- Blended mobility (physical mobility of 5 – 30 days + virtual component)

Activities supported (II)


- All partners in an ICM project can **send and host students and staff** as described in their submitted project and provided that a relevant grant has been secured.
- For ICM projects which include a country from Asia or the Middle East, universities from this country can also contribute with national grants either to send or receive students and staff – these will be considered then as zero-grant participants under Erasmus+, but they are still covered by the administrative framework of the project (documentation, selection & recognition procedures, etc.)
- European partners may use a part of their **intra-European mobility budget (KA131)** to fund their outgoing students mobility under ICM.

Who can apply and how?

- Higher Education Institutions (HEI) in EU27 and 6 associated countries
- The ICM application contains **the countries and partner universities** the European HEI intends to cooperate with, as well as its **cooperation plan in each region**
- This application is submitted by the European HEI to the **Erasmus+ National Agency** located in its country
- The selection of mobility projects is done by Erasmus+ National Agencies




33 European countries have budget for ICM



Results 2021-2024 - Asia


International mobility in Higher Education - Asia - Region 5

International mobility in Higher Education - Middle East - Region 7




What should I be ready for?

- Show how ICM is relevant and strategic for your university...
- ...think how you will focus your student and staff mobility and the benefits it will bring your university
- Think about student-centredness
- Get an OID

What is an OID?

- You need an Organisation ID (OID) to be a partner in an Erasmus+ project
- You can register your organisation online
- Your OID does not need to be validated by a National Agency to take part
- So – don't worry if your OID is still “pending validation”



Steps after selection

- Upon successfully passing the established quality criteria, European universities are allocated **an ICM grant spread in different regional envelopes**
- Project duration: 24 to 36 months
- For every partnership with a secured budget, an **Inter-Institutional Agreement** is needed between the main applicant in Europe and every partner university in third countries before mobilities can start.



- **An Inter-Institutional agreement** links the European University and its partner institution in a non-associated country
- **A beneficiary grant agreement** links the European university and its E+ National Agency
- **A Participant Grant agreement** links the individual with the European university
- **A learning/mobility agreement** links the participant to both universities

Inclusion concern

- Top-up for students with fewer opportunities
- Inclusion support (i.e. Health issues) based on real costs







- A French cognac trader who left school age 16 to travel the world, discovered the power of collective action, devoted his life to uniting people, and launched the European integration project.

*« We are not coalescing States, we are
uniting People »*



Why “Jean Monnet Actions”?

- Jean Monnet was the first « salesman of Europe ». He knew how to convince people of the need for European unity, using simple words which everyone could understand and which still resonate today. He was, fundamentally, a master European educator.

«A time comes when the best we can do is to teach what we think to be right »

Scope of Jean Monnet actions: European Integration Matters

Scope of Jean Monnet actions

- **EU Dimension Focus**

Jean Monnet activities should **promote active European citizenship and the founding values of the European Union** of respect for human dignity, freedom, democracy, equality, the rule of law and respect for human rights, including the rights of persons belonging to minorities (Article 2 of the Treaty on European Union).

- **EU Policy Focus**

Jean Monnet actions should **contribute to spreading knowledge about how these policies can benefit the daily lives of citizens in the EU and/or abroad**, and/or how these can influence the policymaking system, in similar fields, either at the Member State level or abroad at a national, regional or global level. A link should be displayed between the subject of the proposal and the relevant EU policy or topic(s).

- **Public Diplomacy Focus**

Jean Monnet actions also strive to **function as a vector of public diplomacy towards third countries**. They should promote EU values and enhance the visibility of what the European Union stands for and what it intends to achieve.



1. Jean Monnet actions in the field of higher education - Aims

- **Promoting excellence** in teaching and research in EU studies worldwide
- **Generating knowledge and insights**; supporting EU policy-making, while strengthening the role of the EU within Europe and the world
- **Reaching new people**; going beyond academia and specialised audiences, bringing EU knowledge closer to society in the process
- **Fostering dialogue** between academia and society, policymakers, civil servants, civil society, representatives of different levels of education, and the media
- **Functioning as a vector for public diplomacy** towards partner/third countries, promoting EU values while enhancing the visibility of its goals and achievements

Who can apply?

Higher Education Institutions

Any higher education institution in the world can apply. The exceptions are Higher Education Institutions from Belarus and the Russian Federation, which cannot apply.

2. Jean Monnet Policy Debate

Large thematic networks in Higher Education in order to collect, share and discuss among the partners research findings, content of courses and experiences, products (studies, articles, etc.). The coordinator of the network selects the most innovative and interesting results to be provided to the Commission.

- A) Network on internal policy **“A resilient Single Market to boost EU competitiveness”**
- B) Network on external policy issues on the following thematic: **“EU-India”**

B) Network on external policy: 'EU-India'

- **Eligibility**

- A HEI established in the EU Member States and third country associated with the Erasmus+ Programme **or**
- A HEI in a third country not associated to the Programme targeted by this action: **India (Region 5)**

- **Composition**

Proposals must be submitted by a consortium of **at least 12 applicants** (beneficiaries, not affiliated entities) which complies with the following conditions:

- **minimum 6 entities from India (region 5);**
- The coordinator must be established in an EU Member States or a third country associated with the Erasmus+ Programme.

Only beneficiaries (not affiliated entities) count for the consortium composition.



Maximum EU Contribution:

99

1,200,000 EUR

Award Criteria

Although there are **slight differences between Jean Monnet actions**, to be considered for funding proposals **must score at least 70/100 points in total and 15/25 points in each award criterion**. There are four award criteria and **each is worth a maximum of 25 points**.






- **Be coherent!**

Avoid contradictions and “cut and paste” style applications

- **Be explicit!**

Take nothing for granted and don’t assume that experts have prior knowledge in your area. Avoid abbreviations or explain them.

- **Be clear!**

Read the questions carefully, provide information in the correct order as indicated in the form.

- **Be concrete!**

Use examples, justify your claims, provide evidence.

- **Be realistic!**

The application is the basis of your project to be; it is also the cornerstone of the commitment you will sign.

- **Keep it simple!**

Use short sentences, vary the length if you wish to make it more interesting but keep it simple and focused.

- **Remain focused!**

Concentrate exclusively on what is asked of you.

- **Double-check your proposal!**

Make sure you have followed all instructions and the proposal meets all mandatory requirements.







EU grant awarded (M€) per call





n° of projects & % of overarching priorities




