University Centers for Neurodevelopment (NeuroDev)

(October 2024 – September 2027)

Total Budget: €788,752



Academic programs and research on child neurodevelopment are severely lacking in Palestine and much of the Arab world. Building on the momentum of the Erasmus+ NeuCaRe project—which launched the first master's programs in child neuropsychology in 2023—this project aims to address the urgent need for practical training, clinical services, and research in this field.

The main objective is to establish University Centers for Neurodevelopment (UCN) at three Palestinian universities. Each UCN will consist of: a Practical Training Unit for graduate students and practitioners, a Research Unit to support academic research on neurodevelopment, a Community Services Unit to provide clinical support to children and families Additionally, the project will establish the Palestinian Network for Child Neurodevelopment to promote collaboration, knowledge sharing, and national impact.

Total Budget: €873,749



The BASE project aims to elevate higher education in Palestine and Jordan by implementing the Bologna Process in one program chosen from the multiple programs in the colleges of science at each partner university in Palestine and Jordan. The project will utilise Bologna's standards and philosophy to develop these selected programs by creating curricula and establishing the context and environment supporting this development at each HEIs.

Palestine Jordan Model for Dual Vocational Education and Training (PJ-D-VET)

(January 2025 – December 2026)

Total Budget: €399,999

As rapid technological changes reshape industries and economies, education systems must evolve to keep pace. In countries like Palestine and Jordan, vocational and technical education is increasingly important, particularly through the dual system—a model that combines classroom instruction with practical, workplace-based training.



Despite the global recognition of dual VET systems for supporting youth employment and economic growth, Palestine and Jordan have yet to adopt a formal regulatory framework for such a model. Existing initiatives remain fragmented or pilot-based.

This project aims to develop and implement a viable Dual VET model tailored to the national contexts of Palestine and Jordan by leveraging leading European expertise. It focuses on enhancing employment opportunities—especially for young women—by building skills that meet real labor market needs.
